Spring is finally here and most of us are looking forward to sunny skies, warm weather and the light-hearted activities of spring and summer. This is not a time when we want to confront tough topics. However, it is at this time in our history that the difficult issues of prejudice and racism have come to the forefront once again.

The United Church of Christ is urging all our churches to begin a “Sacred Conversation on Race.” Many churches have already begun the conversation. Here in New Fairfield, according to census statistics, our community is 96.8% Caucasian. Because of that, we may think that there is no need to engage in a conversation about prejudice and race. To be completely honest, I didn’t quite know where to begin. But the more I think and pray about it, the more I believe that we do need to start the discussion somewhere. As a nation, unless we can begin to engage in a conversation that is honestly open to all voices and opinions, we will continue to struggle with this issue.

Fortunately, I received an invitation this week to the perfect place to begin – an opportunity to get to know what it’s like to be ‘the other.’ We are invited to:

**“YOU DON’T KNOW ME
UNTIL YOU KNOW ME”**

A one-person show that deals with the issues of race, discrimination, violence prevention, personal identity, suicide, gender equity, homophobia, and the emotional pain felt by special education children. In a gripping, fast paced, 75-minute performance, Michael Fowlin slips in and out of nine characters, both male and female, who "share their stories." The characters speak in an often humorous but, at times, heartbreaking manner. Dr. Michael Fowlin, combines his professional acting talents and his doctorate in clinical psychology to create programs that reach people intellectually and emotionally. His mission is to create an atmosphere of worldwide inclusion, not just tolerance, toward all people.

Moderator's Report – June 2008

May was another very good month. Sometimes it seems that each month is fuller than the last one.

When Liz Yoho asked me to be House Captain for an AmeriCares Homefront project the Senior High Youth Group planned to sponsor, I reluctantly agreed, knowing that it would be a personal stretch. Well, it was, and it was stressful and it was hard work and it took a couple of my Saturdays and a few of my evenings and was it ever worth it!

When all the work was done, Luecella, the homeowner, asked me to thank all who had a hand in helping her, and to thank God for those people. Over my 10-years at CCFNF I'd seen how this congregation continually showed its compassion and Christian values, but through this project I was able to watch it all first hand, and see the real impact on the life of a neighbor. I am humbled by, and have great respect and appreciation for everyone in the congregation, because EVERYONE IN OUR CHURCH (and more) had a hand in this project.

Though Liz Yoho, volunteer coordinator, and Mike Carneiro, assistant house captain, did much of the planning and coordinating, we had over 35 volunteers on May 3rd, AmeriCares Day at a home in Newtown. This group was made up of teens (Sr. High Youth Group and confirmation class), adults (parents of the teens as well as many others from the congregation plus others – friends, co-workers, and even the Newtown First Selectman, Joe Borst). We repaired a kitchen floor, a bathroom floor, scraped and painted the entire exterior of the house and spread gravel for a new driveway surface. Materials were provided mostly by AmeriCares Homefront through state-wide donations, business discounts and sponsorship fees. Our lunch that day was prepared and delivered by members of the CCFNF Service Club. Some of the adults were able to help out only because there was all-day daycare provided for their younger children at the church. Some people helped by providing and/or transporting equipment (ladders, wheel barrows, lumber, rakes, shovels, etc.) to the work site. And MANY people helped by contributing money to the youth mission trip fundraisers over the last couple years, without which we wouldn't have been able to sponsor a project in the first place. Thank you to ALL who helped. AmeriCares Homefront is doing good work through fine people like you.

Among other things worth noting is the overwhelming approval of the congregation for the 2008-2009 church officers and team members which was voted on at the May 18th quarterly meeting. Congratulations to all of you on the list who have agreed to be the church's leaders in the next year, and thank you to all who will continue to assist them.

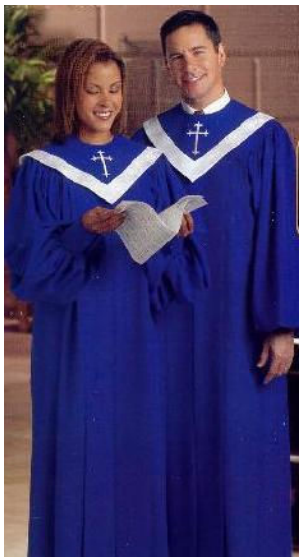
